The Global Network of Public Health Nursing

Discussions on forming a **Global Network of Public Health Nursing (GNPHN)** began in 2009 in Diakonova University in Oslo at the first International Public Health Nursing conference. With the support of a grant from *Irish Aid*, the Network was formally launched in Dublin, by President Michael D. Higgins in June 2014.

The Institute of Community Health Nursing (ICHN) in Ireland provided a home for the network until January 2017 when the secretariat of the Network was transferred to the Institute of Health Visiting (IHV) in the UK. The Network is governed by an eleven-member International Council and its membership now spans 29 countries (www.gnphn.com).

This sharing of knowledge across the world has been the driving force of the four previous International Public Health Nursing conferences that have taken place every 2-3 years.
